Grants are not available for spay or neuter surgeries, dental work, preventative care, ongoing treatments, or end-of-life care.	Applicants may apply for a grant up to 30 days after a procedure.
The Mosby Foundation www.themosbyfoundation.org	unspecified	Non-urgent, non-routine veterinary care	Cannot be used for: diagnostic/testing, general/routine care, completed treatment Animals must be spayed/neutered to be eligible
Frankie's Friends www.frankiesfriends.org	Up to \$2000	To provide family owned pets in need of lifesaving emergency or specialty veterinary care whose caregivers cannot afford the full cost of treatment. Payment is made directly to the veterinarian.	Must provide an estimate of the cost of care from a veterinarian that has already seen your pet, a clear diagnosis, and a specific treatment plan with a "good" prognosis as determined by a licensed veterinarian.
The Oxy and Breezy Foundation www.onyxandbreezy.org/	unspecified	Individuals: medical hardship, payments made to vet	must have applied for and been refused for Care Credit before applying
The Pet Fund www.thepetfund.com	unspecified	Non-basic, non-urgent care (cancer treatment, heart disease, etc.)	To be eligible for our program: 1. Your animal must need non-basic, non-urgent care only, and both you and your companion animal must meet our program criteria. 2. Your animal's medical needs must be able to wait the length of our current wait list, and; 3. You must contact us by email with your request prior to sending your application.

Frosted Faces www.frostedfacesfoundation.org	\$250-\$1000	veterinary care that is required to maintain and enhance the quality of life for senior animals. We can also help with food, supplies, training, grooming, pet deposits, fence repairs, and impound fees.	Goal is to empower families to keep their pets instead of relinquishing them to the shelter or resorting to economical euthanasia.
